His treatise on the Law of Trusts, published in 1863, was a partial fulfilment of an intention then formed of supplying the deficiency; and the favour with which it was received, notwithstanding the defects which were inseparable from the limits which the author had imposed on himself, encouraged him to attempt the preparation of a work of a more comprehensive character, and more nearly approaching to the standard to which the indulgent criticism of the profession had permitted him to aspire. In the fulfilment of this design, the plan of the Law of Trusts has been entirely abandoned.
