His first stories were compiled in the book, "Wild Animals I Have Known," that became popular throughout the United States and Canada. The stories are spellbinding chronicles of wild animal courage, intelligence, and endurance as they valiantly attempt to escape the traps, poisons, guns, and lariats of their human pursuers. Seton was renowned for his scientific studies of American wildlife. His stories about wild animals, however, were a mix of fact and fiction that heightened the drama of each animal's life or death struggle. During the 1890s Seton traveled to the American West and from his experiences wrote the thrilling tales contained in this collection. The exploits of Lobo (wolf), The Pacing Mustang, Tito (coyote), Monarch (grizzly), Coaly-Bay (horse), Johnny Bear, and Badlands Billy (wolf) are presented in their entirety along with many of Seton's drawings. It tells the story of Paco, one of the hundreds of Pacos who live in the capital of the world, an incredible Madrid, and who works as a waiter at the Luarca pension, along with two sisters. Among the airs of the bar, Hemingway weaves the atmosphere that shows three bullfighters, two picadors and a banderillero, all of whom have fallen short. And the banderillero seems someone gray, without the bad luck of the others, but without greater abilities to procure a better destiny than the appearance of a modest businessman.
