Activities include going on a botanical treasure hunt, keeping field notes as a backyard naturalist, and tying knots for ship sails like those on the HMS Beagle. Children also learn how fossils are created, trace genetic traits through their family trees, and discover if acquired traits are passed along to future generations. By encouraging children, parents, and teachers to define the differences between theories and beliefs, facts and opinions, Darwin and Evolution for Kids does not shy away from a theory that continues to spark heated public debate more than a century after it was first proposed. Describes how the engineer George Ferris invented the famous carnival attraction for the renowned 1893 Chicago World's Fair. Presents the life and works of Shakespeare. Includes activities to introduce Elizabethan times, including making costumes, making and using a quill pen, and binding a book by hand. Providing a fresh perspective on one of the most beloved presidents of all time, this illuminating activity book

tells the rich story of Abraham Lincoln's life and details the events of his era. Henry David Thoreau for Kids chronicles the short but influential life of this remarkable American thinker.
