But it was not just the blessings of climbing up from the life of a servant—it was having the heart of a servant that followed her everywhere she went that made Lauren different. It was impossible not to love her once you met her, for in her simplicity and humility, she changed the lives of those she touched along the way. Lauren's story intertwines with Philip's as kingdom meets kingdom meets kingdom in love and war. And the three become one.
