He recounts the difficulties of returning to some semblance of normal life in the midst of a complex political climate, culminating in his daring escape from Soviet Lithuania. In one of the darkest eras of human history, there were those who proved that the goodness of the human spirit survives against all odds. *Boy with a Violin* pays tribute to those who risked everything to save a life, and whose altruism crossed the boundaries of race and religion.
