The Ethics of Autobiography Sep 25 2022 After laying out these theoretical foundations, Loureiro puts them to work in analyzing four of the most fascinating autobiographies written by Spanish exiles: *The Life of Joseph Blanco White*, who lived from 1775 to 1841, *Memoria de la Melancolia* by Maria Teresa Leon (1904-1988), *Coto vedado* and *En los*

reinos de taifa by Juan Goytisolo (born 1931), and Literature or Life by Jorge Semprun (born 1923). The lives of these authors, all of whom were exiled for political reasons, were disrupted by some of the most crucial events in Spain's tortuous road to modernity and democracy. The book closes with a discussion of why there have been so few critical examinations of autobiographies written in modern Spain. Loureiro proposes that, even in today's Spain, stifling social and political forces smother ethical responsibility, which is an essential ingredient in creating autobiographies that dare to be more than a humdrum inventory of personal recollections.

Corporate Ethical Policies in Large Corporations in Argentina, Brazil and Spain Mar 27 2020 This paper examines the status of Corporate

Ethical Policies (CEP) in large companies in Argentina, Brazil and Spain, with a special emphasis on Corporate Ethics Statements (CES) or documents that define the firm's philosophy, values and norms of conduct. It is based on a survey of the 500 largest companies in these nations. The findings reveal many similarities between these countries. Among other things, it emerges that most companies give consideration to ethics in business and have adopted some kind of formal or informal ethical policies. Whether or not they have a CES, companies agree that ethical conduct must be taken into account when selecting, appraising and promoting personnel as an important ethical policy. There is a growing tendency to draw up formal corporate ethics documents. These documents are perceived, first and foremost, as supporting the development of corporate culture. The philosophical ground of these documents is to be found mainly in human virtues, generally accepted social values and universal ethical principles. Most respondents believe that primary responsibility for ethical issues in the company rests with the CEO. Finally, the findings indicate that most companies that devote more resources to communicating and implementing CESs have two or more formal ethics documents. The main differences between the countries included in the study concern the emphasis given to certain aspects, such as avoiding misconduct or taking ethical criteria into account when selecting personnel. The emphasis is greatest in countries where corruption seems most prevalent.

Medicine and Medical Ethics in Medieval and Early Modern Spain Jan 30 2023 This volume presents expanded versions of papers read at a bi-national symposium convened in Jerusalem in December 1992. Financial Economics and Ethics in Early Modern Spain Jun 10 2021 The present thesis examines two late scholastic economic treatises, the *Provechoso tratado de cambios* of Cristóbal de Villalón (1542) and the *Instrucción de mercaderes* of Saravia de la Calle (1544). The thesis performs this examination within the framework of the two principal questions that economic historians have posed concerning the economic literature of the Spanish late scholastics in general. First, is there a clear link between this literature and modern economic science? And second, does this work exhibit a manifest free market orientation? The thesis seeks to contribute to the resolution of these questions through an examination of a neglected subset of the available data, to wit, the two treatises that are its subject matter. As a result of this examination, the thesis presents the following basic conclusions. First, there is a palpable relationship between the work of these two authors and modern economic analysis, in particular that of financial economics. Second, the authors were in fundamental disagreement over most questions, but particularly so concerning the justice of the free market. Specifically, they held completely opposing views on the determinants of the just price. Villalón argues against the justice of subjective market forces, and Saravia presents strong counter arguments to this position. The thesis concludes that the two treatises represent evidence of an early stage in the debate between the left and the right in matters related to the economic order.

International Management Ethics Apr 08 2021 What can we learn about management ethics from other cultures and societies?
