Peter Ryhiner – hero, adventurer, and romantic – was one of the world's most active wild animal collectors. Born in Basel, Switzerland, on January 1, 1920, Peter knew by the time he was eight years old that he wanted to be a naturalist and explorer – and thought about nothing else.
