Even though the unit focuses on transformations, the strategies presented can be modified to any mathematical concept, at any grade level. Through the development of this unit, the researcher concluded that it is possible to differentiate instruction to meet the needs of students and meet the expectations of the Common Core State Standards if assessment data is analyzed to plan instruction.

Terminology is an important part of all E06.81 standards. A separate terminology standard provides definitions of economic techniques and terms used in the 25 other E06.81 standards. Case Study 3 is an example of value analysis of high rise building columns. Case Study 4 describes how to manage cost and mitigate risks for bridge projects and Case Study 5 is part of economic evaluation of a long-span bridge from concept to construction and beyond.
