This brief issues booklet provides basic information about the role of the Catholic Church in Poland, the erosion of Communist party leadership over the past year (as of 1981), the rise of the Solidarity Union and the economic problems plaguing the Polish people. An introduction is followed by the following sections: (1) "History of a Millennium"; (2) "Communist Poland"; (3) "Solidarity"; (4) "Church, Farm, and Freedom"; (5) "Poland between East and West"; and (6) "1981 and Beyond: A Personal Epilogue." A list of discussion questions and an 11-item reference list conclude the booklet. (EH) This book traces the arduous journey of the founding of the Communist Party of China 100 years ago from the perspective of the great cause of the rejuvenation of the Chinese nation and the 100th anniversary of the founding of the CPC. It outlines the historical context of the founding of the Party, analyzes and interprets its background and historical necessity, and fully reveals its significant role and far-reaching significance for the great rejuvenation of the Chinese nation. The book is divided into eight parts: Parts 1 and 2 focus on analyzing the historical background and social foundation of the emergence of the Communist Party of China; Parts 3 and 4 describe the establishment of the guiding ideology of the Communist Party of China; Parts 5 and 6 describe the organizational activities of Party building; Parts 7 and 8 comment on the full-scale development of the actual revolutionary movement that was led by the Party, the formulation of the Party's constitution, the introduction of the current stage in the revolutionary program, and the completion of the founding tasks. I identify one crucial error that accounts for recent American economic decline, three obstacles to rectifying that error, and three reforms to existing institutions that remove the three obstacles. The error is to have thought of 'national development' as a one-off achievement, rather than as a perpetual process of ongoing renewal. The three obstacles, all in the nature of classic collective action problems, are how to coordinate the formulation and execution of a regularly updated national development policy, how to capture and incentive-compatibly channel the gains to continuous infrastructural renewal in a mixed public/private economy, and how to control macro-financial conditions in a manner that renders investment in continuous industrial renewal privately rational. The three responsive institutional reforms are a National Reconstruction and Development Council (NRDC) that combines all cabinet-level executive agencies into 'an FSOC for continuous national development,' a National Investment Corporation (NIC) that designs price-signal-impounding and equity-stake-justifying financial instruments in connection with national infrastructure projects, and a newly 'Spread Fed' that restores the Regional Federal Reserve Banks to their original status as a network of regional development banks. Should we fail to make full use of this opportunity, the United States will fail, along with all the other nation-states that are incapable of redefining the problems so that new solutions become possible. This revolutionary Grand Strategy will be the deciding factor between nation-states that fail and the few (if any) that will not just survive but actually thrive. A ruthless pandemic, an inept and malign government response, polarizing protests, and an election marred by conspiracy theories left many citizens in despair about their country and its democratic experiment. With pitiless precision, the year exposed the nation's underlying conditions—discredited elites, weakened institutions, blatant inequalities—and how difficult they are to remedy. In *Last Best Hope*, George Packer traces the shocks back to their sources. He explores the four narratives that now dominate American life: Free America, which imagines a nation of separate individuals and serves the interests of corporations and the wealthy; Smart America, the world view of Silicon Valley and the professional elite; Real America, the white Christian nationalism of the heartland; and Just America, which sees citizens as members of identity groups that inflict or suffer oppression. In lively and biting prose, Packer shows that none of these narratives can sustain a democracy. To point a more hopeful way forward, he looks for a common American identity and finds it in the passion for equality—the “hidden code”—that Americans of diverse persuasions have held for centuries. Today, we are challenged again to fight for equality and renew what Alexis de Tocqueville called “the art” of self-government. In its strong voice and trenchant analysis, *Last Best Hope* is an essential contribution to the literature of national renewal. The Foundation for National Renewal has produced a Draft Constitution that is now ready for wide public debate and amendment as required. This book presents that Draft, in the hope that it will ultimately become a blueprint for gradual Constitutional change. In year two, the LCCNR program trained 106 Timorese from three distinct sectors: those working to return the Internally Displaced (IDP); youth; and government officials participating in the National Priorities Program (NP). The sector approach permitted the development of more effective working relationships between leaders, better retention of the skills and tools as leaders had a reason to use the skills to address common problems, and offered a new model of leadership to key Timorese constituencies. Any new leadership training should consider a systems perspective as well as skills. The LCCNR program has come to a close and in keeping with our commitment to sharing our learning, this report is devoted to the lessons learned and includes a set of recommendations that any similar future program should consider. This issue focuses on the Alliance for National Renewal (ANR), the ambitious effort launched in 1994 to build a network of representatives from the public, private, and nonprofit sectors with the goal of creating a national dialogue on community renewal. It reflects on the accomplishments and challenges ANR has faced since its inception, and demonstrates how ANR successfully created a safe civic space that allows citizens to engage in collaborative problem solving. With an introductory essay from esteemed scholar and Common Cause founder John W. Gardner, articles address the phases of ANR's development, including its goal to foster improved relationships across service sectors, its role in integrating young people in community-based work for social change and its potential in helping nonprofit advocacy groups, university administrators, and government officials to combine efforts and resources in ways that foster habits of lifelong civic participation in young adults. Examples of ANR efforts to connect grassroots organizations are detailed with case studies of successful programs implemented in a community building program in San Antonio Texas, a K-12 school reform effort in Washington D.C., and the Rebuild L.A. program.
