X. HIGHLAND, DONIPHAN COUNTY. AN ACT legilliing an election. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. That the election held in the city of Highland, Doniphan county, Kansas, in April, 1871, for the purpose of organizing under the act incorporating cities of the third class, and choosing officers under the same, is hereby declared legal and valid, in so far as any irregularity or informality in the notice of such election existed; and that all acts and proceedings of the mayor and coun- cilmen of said city are declared to be legal, the same as if such notice of election had been in the manner prescribed by law.
